Hi Big Sanders,

We find ourselves closing out the 2023 beautiful summer of sun and heat. Unfortunately, it brought on some drought that saw our lake levels drop almost two feet. Getting the docks and lifts out of the water this fall was a challenge for owners and those who professionally remove them. Let's hope for a snow filled winter to bring our lake back to normal levels.

The lake quality continues to be outstanding and as far as we know, we are still free of invasive species. The board hired Steve Henry, a Minnesota DNR Certified Aquatic Plant Surveyor, to do an invasive species check and aquatic plant point intercept of our lake. It's

important for us to be a step ahead of any problems that may arise. Results of the survey were reassuring that our beautiful Big Sand continues to be healthy and AIS free. See the article elsewhere in this newsletter for more information.

We continue to endorse and contribute to the AIS Watercraft Inspection Program. After the first of the year, we will be sending two statements for membership in the 2024 Big Sand Lake Association. One for your membership dues of \$50 and the other for a contribution to the Big Sand Lake Charitable Fund held by the Northwest Minnesota Foundation. These will need to be two separate payments either through PayPal or by personal check.




It is my honor to serve you as your President of the Big Sand Lake Association, and I look forward to meeting all of you.

BIG SAND LAKE AIS WATERCRAFT INSPECTIONS SUMMARY

WATER QUALITY REPORTS

Thank you to BSLA volunteers Richard Provinzino, Gene Fladeboe, Randy Seaver, and Bob Bray for testing and monitoring Big Sand's water quality. Gene Flaboe collected monthly water samples and delivered them for analysis by RMB laboratories. Both Gene and Richard conducted and tracked frequent sechi disc readings. Sechi disk readings of 11-15 feet early in the summer were concerning. Fortunately the readings were much better as the season went on, with readings of the usual average of 24 and 25 feet. We can, and must, do our part to help Big Sand pristine by keeping fertilizer, grass clippings and leaves out of the water and by maintaining tress and vegetation on our properties to contain run-off. Bob Bray conducted the zebra mussel villager netting in August. Results of that analysis will be available later in the fall. Gene Fladeboe who officially tracks the water level of the lake for the DNR, reports that the lake came up one inch during fall rains. Aaron Anderson, Hubbard County Environmental Specialist and Watercraft Inspections Coordinator, provided the following results for Big Sand's inspections as of October 8th, 2023 and comparison with the 2022 results. Inspections were continuing on weekends during October.

GREAT NEWS! SURVEY DETECTS NO AIS!

The BSLA Board voted at their September 9th Board meeting to explore having a Professional AIS Detection survey performed on Big Sand Lake. Information regarding a professional survey was presented at the September 30 Board Meeting. The Board



voted to contract with Aquatic Survey Professionals, owned by Steve Henry. It was agreed the survey would accomplish both Aquatic Invasive Species Detection and Vegetative Plant Identification. This will allow an update of the Vegetative Mapping Documentation done on Big Sand Lake in 2009. Mr. Henry will provide data to the DNR for updating our 2009 Vegetative Mapping Survey. The Board is pleased to accomplish both of these projects through one professional survey.

Aquatic Survey Professionals surveyed our lake October 2nd, 7th, and 8th. Great News - NO Aquatic Invasive Species were detected!!

The survey cost came in at \$4590.34, lower than the proposed cost of \$4700.34. The Survey costs are being covered by the Big Sand Lake Charitable Fund.

She loved to share the lake surrounded by family, loved ones, and friends. With her husband Richard, Evelyn traveled the world extensively, but she always said, "My favorite place to take in God's creation was at the top of Vail Mountain and at the end of the dock on Big Sand Lake." Evelyn's daughters, sons-in-law, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren have grown up calling Big Sand home for the summers and the breath-taking views from the top of the ridge looking over the lake.

The history of the Kvamme Fjord cabin has seen many families enjoying the beautiful view throughout the years. It was originally purchased by Charles and Grace Hasley. Charles and his son Charles Jr. were killed in an auto accident west of Park Rapids on Highway 34 August 20, 1951. Grace Hasley and her daughter returned for one more summer before the property was sold to Clarence Tamm in 1954. The Tamm family enjoyed many summers on Big Sand Lake before selling the property to Savacools in 1966. The Savacools retained the property for 4 years before selling it to the Fernandes family in 1970. Richard and Evelyn Kvamme purchased the property in 1972, leaving their cabin on Lake Melissa that they enjoyed for 22 years. After Richard passed away in 2011, Evelyn continued to enjoy her favorite place to be from Spring until Fall. Richard and Evelyn's daughters, Debra Tharaldson and Yvonne Waters, have been the current owners of Kvamme Fjord since 2012.

Margaret "Dorsey" Phelps, age 82, passed away on October 31, 2022 in Iowa City, Iowa. Although she was not able to visit her cherished "Point House," in her final years, she continued to make plans for its improvement and care, as she had for the previous 30 years. She knew and appreciated the restorative powers of Big Sand Lake since her parents bought the place from Howard Fletcher, in 1968. Howard and his wife Linda had built a year-round home next door and sold the 1918 "cabin" and its contents to Dorsey's parents, Gerry and Betty Wetlaufer, the men having been great fishing buddies. Dorsey and her husband, Chuck, began spending a few weeks every summer there with siblings, cousins, and their own children.

Dorsey enjoyed fishing with her dad in the early years, gathering with family, and watching long sunsets. She always had a gourmet meal waiting for the weary traveler and had many art and science projects for her kids and grandkids. She strove to keep the place as true to the original as possible, making curtains and painting household objects that transported its visitors to a simpler time. Dorsey's son James Phelps (Dana) and her brother John Wetlaufer (Helen Turley) will continue to care for this family property.

Stephen H. Duer - April 26, 1943 - June 2, 2023

Steve was born and raised in Kansas City, MO and spent most of his life there working in the excavating business. During the summers as a young boy in the late 1940's he loved being Up North at his family fishing cabins on Big Sand Lake, and later with his children in the 1980's and nearly every summer from the mid 90's until his death. The cabins are situated next to Pine Cone Lodge at 19666 Grouse Rd. The lots were purchased by Steve's aunt, Kansas City pediatric physician, Mildred Duer, MD in the 1940's. Aunt Millie died in 2006 and left the property to Steve. It has continued to be enjoyed by family and friends during the summer months with the hope that the legacy will be preserved for future generations to enjoy.


MARK KALVODA


